

Hello from Country Fabrics,

Looks like rain this morning, guess rain is in the forecast. We are back to mowing lawn even though it seems we had just put the mowers away. Gardens are looking good even though it's kind of hard to get tilling done in between the many rains we were having lately. With Harvey's help, we got everything tilled and potatoes

ridged last night. Now I am ready to mulch between rows. I use old leaves from last year and really like it. Less weed pulling. I'd like to plant a few watermelons and cantaloupes yet before it rains. We will have no field melons this year and I already know we are going to miss them. Wonder how we would have done it as it seems we are busy as is.

Men are busy logging and building more fences at their other farm. I think fences are about finished and grass is way deep, maybe they'll have to make a cutting hay before

turning cattle to pasture. While making fences they have met up with many interesting new neighbors. Harvey just fixed a spring fed water trough which will supply fresh water for the cattle all summer. Sounds like he was pretty excited about all the clear fresh water. Later on he has another spring he'd like to do the same.

Trees they are cutting are ash and beech. I never heard how many, but sounds like quite a few. An old friend, Abe Raber from Ashland, set up his portable saw and comes every other day sawing lumber with the mens help. With the 15 mile distance it works out nice every other day and gives his horse a break. And since he's a farmer, he needs those days off too.

The ash trees are all sawed to boarding lumber and the beech is for replacing a few barn floors. Abe will also cut a few elm trees to use for wagon tongues and save some number one ash boards to use for buggy boxes for the Amish Community. Two of the barns, they took out the old thrasher floors what was left, that will go for salvage lumber. Then replace floors with two layers of 1" beech boards. The largest ash tree they cut was 150 years old according to the rings they counted. The main log they sawed was 32, 2in x 8inx 16ft peices. As the saying goes large trees grow were there is fertile soil.

Yesterday they were seeding new pasture land with oat, clover, and grass mix. The oats are only to protect the young tender clover, grass plants until it has established a healthy root. Some of the land they had done last year did not survive the winter so they reseeded.

CLAMSHELL

Another great classic design updated by Judy Niemeyer using paper piecing techniques. The clamshell is split into right and left halves allowing you to join the blocks into vertical columns. All points are floating for easier construction. A small accent strip, cut on the bias, is added using curved paper piecing techniques. The sashing between columns eliminates matching and bulk from stacked seams.



No prior paper piecing experience required. Excellent for all skill levels. First session is clamshell construction, while second is sashing and borders.

Judy's sample on the pattern cover uses fifteen clamshell fabrics, one sashing and six backgrounds. My sample uses 27 clamshell fabrics, one sashing and one background – very scrappy! Finished size is 62" x 76", but can be enlarged.

Have you ever said, "If only I had room in my bag for one more thing"? If so, this bag is for you! Using the QuiltSmart grid interfacing technique for easy construction, you'll have a bag that is not only roomy and comfortable, but you'll have perfectly-matched seams too. (2 ½" or 5" squares are used to make the patchwork.) The bag bottom measures approximately 10" square and the sides are about 17" tall.

are two layout options for this guilt and both look great and are easy to do! Twenty 2 1/2" strips and 1 1/2 yard of background fabric is all that's needed to make this 48" x 60" quilt! Why not get a full jelly roll (40 strips) and 3 yards of background fabric and make one large or two small quilts?

STRAIGHT & EASY TABLE RUNNER **AND PLACE MATS**

These table runners and place mats look awesome in any fabric combination, so let your imagination run wild and create a usable work of art.

IMPATIENS PLACEMATS



But each little patch, as its fitted in and sewn to keep it together, makes a finished block in this life of ours, filled with sun and rainy weather. So let me work on life's patchwork quilt, through the rainy days and the sun, trusting that when I have finished my block, the master may say, **Well Done**.

Chunky Ham and Cheese Soup

Ingredients

2 cups water 1/4 tsp. pepper

2 cups peeled, diced potatoes 1 cup fully cooked, cubed ham

1/2 cup diced carrots 1/4 cup butter

1/2 cup chopped celery 1/4 cup all-purpose flour

1/4 cup chopped onion 2 cup milk

1 1/2 tsp. salt 2 cup shredded Cheddar cheese

Directions

In a large soup kettle combine first seven

ingredients, bring to a boil. Reduce heat, simmer, covered, untill vegetables are tender. Add ham. In a saucepan melt butter and stir in flour untill smooth. Gradually add milk. Bring to a boil, cook and stir for 2 minutes. Stir in cheese until melted. Add soup and serve. Yield: 6 to 8 servings.

Mom's 7ea

Ingredients

15 quarts water

20 Lipton tea/ Iced tea bags 120 sprigs spearment leaf tea

12 cups sugar

3 cups lemon juice

Directions

Bring water to a boil. Add tea bags and leaf tea. Allow to brew for 1/2 hour. Add sugar and lemon juice. Reheat to a boil and pour into quart jars; turn upside down to seal. When ready to use, add water to whatever strength of tea you like.
