CALCULATING BINDING YARDAGE

- 1) Measure all four sides of the quilt and add up the measurements.
- 2) Add 10" to #1 answer to account for piecing the strips and going around the corners of the guilt.
- 3) Divide #2 answer by the width of the fabric that you will be using (usually around 40") to determine the number of strips you will have to cut to go around the entire quilt.
- 4) Multiply #3 answer by the width of strip to be cut.

Example: Quilt measures 50" x 60".

Add up all sides of the quilt: 50+50+ 60+60=220"

Add 10" to the number above: 220+10=230" of binding needed

230" divided by 40" (width of fabric) = 5.75 strips Round up to 6 strips

6 strips \times 2.5" wide strips= 15" = 1/2 yard


PAINTED CROSS







Salsa

Ingredients

14 c. chopped tomatoes (peel)

3 c. chopped onions

1 1/2 c. hot peppers (optional)

3 Tbsp. salt

1 Tbsp. black pepper

1 Tbsp. chili powder

1 1/2 tsp. cumin ground

7 Tbsp. clear gel

1/2 c. cider vinegar

1 1/2 tsp. garlic powder

1 c. tomato sauce

Directions Mix all together. Put in jars. Cold Pack 1 1/2 hours. Makes approximately 10 pt.

Japanese Chicken

Ingredients

3 lb. boneless, skinless chicken thighs

1 c. flour

1 tsp. garlic powder 1tsp. seasoned salt

1 tsp. paprika

1 c. sugar

1/2 c. boiling water

1/2 c. vinegar

3 Tbsp. soy sauce

1/2 tsp. salt

Directions Dip chicken in flour. Fry each side until browned. Place chicken in a 9"x13" baking dish.

Combine garlic powder, seasoned salt and paprika. Sprinkle seasonings over chicken. Stir together sugar, boiling water, vinegar, soy sauce and salt until sugar is dissolved. Pour over chicken.

Bake uncovered at 350° for 1 hour.
