


#### **Good Morning!**

My garden has done really well this summer, but we had to water more than usual. Yesterday I canned pickles & pizza sauce and froze green beans. Now today its pickle relish & corn. By freezing them it separates the pulp from the clear juice, it does not need much cooking afterwards. I tried some late red beets and carrots, they are just now peeping out the of soil. I figured the way the weeds are still growing they will probably be OK before frost hits.

My flower garden is very small but I still enjoy to make a bouquet every once in a while. Three of our daughters are doing fresh cuts and seems like they are quite busy. People are at home more this year so it takes more bouquets to enjoy. They will use quart jars or any kind of flower vases. But seems like flower vases they never have enough. Does anyone have vases they want to sell or get rid of? Whenever I can I watch for used ones. Last week my daughter-in-law, five granddaughters, Marnita and I went shopping and I came home with 80 used vases. My daughters will be very happy for them. They will not last more than a week, but it will help.





Harvey wants an early breakfast as today they are moving cattle. They are taking 750 weight off pastureland and putting them in the barns. Then after the pastures green up again they will put small 400 weights on probably around October, they will stay there till around February. They always have fresh spring water, but will need to be fed after grass gets short.

Tomorrow morning we are leaving for Pennsylvania to see our children and grandchildren. Will stay a few days. I want to help make fruit slush and fill small Styrofoam cups with lids and freeze for school lunches, by noon it is still cold for lunch. We are still planning on having our annual fabric tent sale. So we are busy getting ready for that. Keeping shelves stocked is never ending. Certain fabrics are hard to get, but for the most

part we are not having trouble with ordering fabrics. Sewing is a fun hobby to have, especially during the times we were asked to say at home. I had so much fun sewing masks, as time allowed. And still enjoy doing special orders. Enjoy the rest of your summer & fall.

### **SQUARETANGULAR**



### Pickle Relish

Makes approx. 8 pints

#### **Ingredients**

18 cucumbers 1 Qt. onions 3 red peppers 3 green peppers	Step 1	1 tsp. turmeric 3 cups sugar 3 cups vinegar	Step 3
2 qt. water 1/2 cup salt 1 cup vinegar	Step 2	1 tsp. celery salt 1 tsp. mustard seed	Step 4

#### **Directions**

- Shred the vegetables, but not too fine.
- Add 2 qt. water, 1/2 cup salt & 1 cup vinegar. Boil for 15 minutes. Drain.
- Add 1 tsp. turmeric, 3 cups sugar & 3 cups vinegar. Boil for 15 minutes
- 4. Add 1 tsp. celery salt & 1 tsp. mustard seed. Put boiling hot mix into jars and seal.

### Pepper Poppers

#### Ingredients

12 small sweet peppers or jalapeños8 oz cream cheese1/3 cup sour cream6 slices bacon - fried or crumbled 1/4 cup onions, finely diced
1/2 cup cheddar cheese, shredded
1 tsp. garlic powder
1 tsp seasoned salt parmesan cheese

#### **Directions**

Preheat oven to 375°

Slice peppers in half, remove core and seeds. Mix together rest of ingredients until well combined. Stuff into pepper halves and put on buttered baking sheet. sprinkle with parmesan cheese.

Bake for 20-25 minutes.

Note: They are also great on the grill. And if you like hot stuff give the jalapeños a try.
