Hello to all readers!



All is quiet this morning except the crackle of the wood stove. Harvey is doing desk work so I'll try to have a silent visit with you all. We are enjoying the beautiful fall days, cleaning out the garden & flower beds, raking leaves, etc., but my elephant ears & a few other bulbs I am waiting on just the right time for Harvey to help.

The elephant ears were very tall this year again. I did not measure, but the tallest one had leaves 26" by 42" and was taller than me. The starter came from Meadow View Greenhouse. I had kept the root over winter, so will try to save them again. I put the roots in dark basement over winter and don't let roots dry out.

Store shelves are slowly filling up again. Salesmen are showing a lot of new fabrics here lately and they are coming and showing instead of just calling by phone. Mask making has slowed down a bit and now its fabric for dresses, quilts and other winter projects. Hand quilting seems to be coming back more again. A few years ago I could not keep the hand quilters busy and just now they are overwhelmed with quilts to be hand done. Especially those quilts, etc., that have sentimental value, by hand quilting they will keep its value. Machine quilting is good, especially for those that will be used & washed a lot. I also have a few of those quilts we are using every day.

Farmers are quite busy making use of the nice days we are having. Most corn & soybeans are done. We do not have soybeans, but have seen some beautiful neighboring fields. Corn fields in the surrounding areas were good. Anywhere from 160 to 230 bushels field average.



Seems like lots of neighboring fields are already tilled for next year. But son David still needs to seed 45 acres of rye for grain, also 65 acres of wheat for wheatch, which will be chopped for cattle feed in spring. Corn fodder baling is now done, was a nice fall to get it when dry. It will then be used as bedding for cattle over winter. Next things is getting all those round bales closer to the barn so when snow starts falling they



can get to them. Now that crops are all in, Harvey's main focus is screening this years compost and getting it under roof before snow falls. Some he will not screen for the farmers and grazers who don't need it screened. Some grazing farmers will blend compost & gypsum to spread on pastures, which gives them high nutrient value. Christmas is much more than family feasts, decorations, and generous gifts. Christmas celebrates the beginning of the greatest life that ever lived, the most incredible gift our world ever received, and the hope that we have eternally. 
YELLOW BRICK ROAD

AVA'S GARDEN







Spicy Pulled Pork

Ingredients

1 (5-7 lb.) pork shoulder

Blend:

1 onion, cut into quarters
1 tbsp. chili powder
½ cup brown sugar
4 garlic cloves, peeled

1 tsp. dried oregano
1-2 tbsp. salt, to taste
freshly ground black pepper
3 tbsp. olive oil
2 tbsp. white vinegar

Directions

Blend all ingredients, except pork, in blender.

Rub mixture over meat and bake at 300°F for 6-7 hours.

Pull apart. Before serving, sprinkle lime juice over the top.

Serve with flour tortillas, lettuce, cheese, etc.

Pretzel Buns

Makes 12 buns

Ingredients

1½ cups warm water
1 tablespoon active dry yeast
1/3 cup brown sugar
¼ teaspoon salt
4 cups unbleached white flour

2 cups hot water
2 tablespoons baking soda
Pretzel salt, for sprinkling
Melted butter, for brushing tops

Directions

Using a stand mixer fitted with the dough hook, mix together warm water and yeast. Add brown sugar, salt, and flour. Knead on medium speed until dough is smooth and pulls away from the sides of the bowl, around 4-5 minutes. Cover and let rise 10 minutes. Divide dough into 12 even pieces and form into flat 3½-inch round buns. Mix together hot water and baking soda. Dip entire roll into soda mixture. After dipping, place the bun in the palm of your hand and slash the top 1/8 inch deep. Lay on a parchment-lined baking sheet. Sprinkle tops with pretzel salt. Bake at 375°F for 12 minutes. Brush tops with melted butter and serve immediately.

For soft pretzels: This recipe can also be used for soft pretzels. Use ½-¾ cup more flour. The dough cannot be too sticky to roll. After forming pretzels, prepare as directed for buns.

Crispy Chicken Nuggets

Ingredients

Canola Oil
8 boneless, skinless
chicken thighs
1 cup buttermilk

Breading

1 cup unbleached white flour
1 cup panko bread crumbs
1 tsp. paprika
1 tsp. poultry seasoning
1 TBSP seasoned salt
½ tsp. pepper

Directions

Line a baking sheet with parchment paper and coat well with canola oil. Mix together breading ingredients.

Cut chicken into 2-inch pieces. Dip chicken pieces in buttermilk (see tip below), then coat with breading. Place chicken on the baking sheet and spray or brush tops with canola oil. This helps make them crispy.

Bake at 375°F for 20-30 minutes, flipping halfway, or until juices run clear.

TIP: If I have time, I soak the chicken in the buttermilk in the refrigerator for 1-2 hours before coating with breading. Soaking in buttermilk ahead of time tenderizes the chicken through the actions of enzymes naturally present in buttermilk.
