Good morning friends and readers,

Time to get this letter moving so I will try my best. I am sitting in Ashland University Hospital with my wife Rachel. This is the 6th day and it looks like a few more to go. She came in for kidney stones but then when things didn't change, an E. coli infection showed up in her blood. She is now on the mend and feeling better. Thanks again to the staff at UH, nurses, and doctors.

Rachel and Marnita had planted an early garden of potatoes, corn, beans etc., then early May had frost 3 mornings in a row. The veggie tops froze. The potatoes will keep right on growing, but it will be harder on the corn and beans. With a little time they'll probably be OK.

The canning lids and rings finally arrived - wide and regular mouth as long as supplies lasts.

A few changes have been made at the store to help make it somewhat easier for the girls. So far they all seem to like it how it is. Liz & Toby now have a toy corner, but I am not sure that it has entered their minds that it is really what it is meant to be.

I am busy bagging and marketing compost. We wish the raised bed and gardeners a good growing season!

We've had a very busy spring. Didn't take time to cut dandelion greens (my favorite dish). The boys have early corn planted and looks like some will have to be replanted due to cold and wet weather. We then have 90 acres of wheat forage to cut, then right back to corn. The 500 wt. calf are out on pasture for the summer. Beef Cows are calving, we have 10 more to go.

Now that the 500 wt. calf are all on pasture, next is to clean out all the barns. All will be hauled to compost pad and start the next year's compost.

April 1st we had started the first batch. We then add leaves, corn fodder, clay, etc. We monitor moisture at 45% and temperature between 130-150.° If heavy rains are in the forecast, wind rows are covered. Working with it in 16 weeks we should have a finished humus compost.







ONE SMALL POSITIVE THOUGHT IN THE MORNING CAN CHANGE YOUR WHOLE DAY.

Makes 2 (9-inch) pies

Ingredients

Fruit Filling

2 cups water
3/4 cup granulated sugar
3 tablespoons Clear Jel
dash salt
1 (3-ounce) box strawberry gelatin
10 cups sliced fresh strawberries

Whipped Cream

1 pint (2 cups) heavy cream ½ cup powdered sugar ½ teaspoon vanilla extract pinch salt

Directions

Make Filling: In a small saucepan, stir together water, granulated sugar, Clear Jel, and salt. Cook until thickened. Remove from heat and add strawberry gelatin. Let cool to room temperature and add sliced strawberries. Pour into two baked pie shells and refrigerate until set.

Make Whipped Cream: In a medium bowl and using an electric mixer, beat together whipped cream ingredients until peaks form. Dollop on pies before serving.

Roasted Asparagus

Ingredients

1 pound fresh asparagus
1-2 garlic cloves, minced
¾ teaspoon salt
2 tablespoons Parmesan cheese olive oil spray

Directions

Preheat oven to 375°F. Wash and trim woody ends of asparagus. Lay spears on a baking sheet. Sprinkle with garlic, salt, and cheese. Roast for 12-18 minutes. Serves 4.

Roasting time can vary depending on how tendercrisp or soft you prefer them.
