STRENGTH FROM **SURRENDER**

Most of us recognize The Serenity Prayer, but many of us don't know where it started. The prayer has become one of the most well-known prayers among both religious and non-religious people. The prayer goes as follows:

"God grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change; courage to change the things I can' and the wisdom to know the difference."

Less well known is the second part of the prayer:

"Living one day at a time; enjoying one moment at a time; accepting hardships as the pathway to peace; taking, as He did, this sinful world as it is, not as I would have it; trusting that He will make all things right if I surrender to His Will; that I may be reasonably happy in this life and supremely happy with Him forever in the next. Amen."

American theologian Reinhold Niebuhr (1892 - 1971) is attributed as the author of The Serenity Prayer and it was obtained from an excerpt of his diary by one of his students, Winnifred Crane Wygal, who posted it in newspaper articles in the 1930s. Wygal then placed it in a book of worship in 1940.

The original version that Niebuhr wrote went as follows:

"O God and Heavenly Father grant to us the serenity of mind to accept that which cannot be changed, courage to change that which can be changed, and wisdom to know the one from the other through Jesus Christ, our Lord, Amen."

The prayer became more widespread when an Alcoholics Anonymous member found it in a New York Herald Tribune obituary in 1941 and brought it to the group's attention. William Griffith Wilson, cofounder of Alcoholics Anonymous, and his staff like the prayer so much that they printed and distributed it to their members. It has been a part of AA recovery ever since.

It can be used in difficult situations when you need to call on God for serenity, acceptance, courage and wisdom.

Serenity

Serenity is the first virtue mentioned in The Serenity Prayer and is the exact opposite of anxiety. Acceptance is a key part of finding serenity. One general rule is you can control yourself, but you can not control others. Surrendering control can help keep you emotionally strong and at peace.

Courage

Courage, according to the second part of the prayer, is what we need to change the things we can. There is a big gulf between the things we can do and the things we must do. There is no shortage of the things that we can change, but we need to recognize our limitations. We can not do it all. Courage usually begins with changing ourselves.

Wisdom

Wisdom, which includes both truth and compassion, is needed to identify what can be changed from what can not. Anxiety can prevent you from recognizing the difference. A wise person tries to figure out what they can control and what they can not, which again helps prevent anxiety. By practicing wisdom, we will generally know when to accept our situations and when to be courageous.

The Serenity Prayer is a great way to calm yourself when you are feeling stressed, angry or triggered.

It's a great prayer to use for anyone who needs a transformative mindset. It's a prayer that calls on a a higher power to help us with our emotional health in our own way.





Make-Ahead Breakfast Enchiladas

Ingredients

1 lb. bulk breakfast sausage 1 medium red pepper, chopped 1 small onion, chopped 2½ cups shredded cheese, divided 10 flour tortillas

TOPPING:

2 cups half-and-half 6 eggs 1 tbsp flour

Directions

Cook sausage, pepper & onion until done. Drain if necessary. Let cool slightly & stir in 2 cups cheese. Spoon 1/3 cup mixture into each tortilla. Roll up and place seam side down in 9" x 13" pan. Whisk together topping, pour over tortillas. Cover tightly & refrigerate overnight. In the morning, bake, covered, at 350° for 30-40 minutes or until eggs are set. Sprinkle with remaining ½ cup shredded cheese & bake uncovered for 10 more minutes. Serve with salsa & sour cream.

Schi

Ingredients

Mix of pork & beef on the bones with some fat Potatoes Pepper Diced onion Fresh parsley Shredded carrot Fresh tomato Shredded cabbage Bay leaf Pepper Fresh parsley Fresh dill Bouillon, if needed Shredded cabbage

Directions

Cook meat until tender. Remove meat from broth to cool & pick from the bones. Add potatoes to broth & begin cooking. Sauté onions & carrots in some oil in a skillet. Add them to cooked potatoes in the broth with the cabbage & shredded meat. Add rest of the seasonings. Bring to a boil until cabbage is tender & flavored through. Serve w/ sour cream or mayo. If you want to make borscht, sauté grated beets with the carrots & onions. This makes the soup pinker. This is the only difference between schi (cabbage soup) & borscht. Schi is also very tasty cooked with chicken.

Chocolate Chip Tarts

Ingredients

1 cup butter, softened 1/4 cup sugar 3/4 cup brown sugar 2 eggs 1 tsp vanilla

1. Cream together.

1 tsp baking soda ½ cup instant vanilla pudding 2 ¼ cups flour

2. Add, mixing until blended.

2 cups mini choc. chips

3. Stir in.

4. Place dough into well-greased miniature muffin pans. Bake at 350° for 8-10 minutes. Remove from oven and press centers down immediately. Cool for a few minutes before removing from pans. Cool completely.

8 oz. cream cheese, softened 1½ cups powdered sugar 2 cups cool whip 1 tsp vanilla

5. Mix together, beat well.

6. Use a decorating tube and fill centers of cooled tarts with filling. Garnish with mint chocolate chips, blueberries or whatever you wish.
