Barbecue Chicken Wings

Ingredients

2 lbs. boneless chicken, cut up in wing-sized pieces, or 6-8 bone-in wings

1 tsp. seasoned salt

1/2 tsp. pepper

2 tbsp. barbeque sauce

2 tbsp. olive oil

1 tsp. garlic powder

2 cups flour or less

Sauce

1/4 cup butter, melted

1/4 cup honey

1/2 cup barbecue sauce

Directions

Mix together seasoned salt, pepper, barbecue sauce and olive oil. Put in containter with lid. Add chicken and shake until covered. Add garlic powder and flour. Shake until covered. Spray cooking sheets. Put chicken on sheets and spray them. Bake at 425° for 10 minutes, then flip wings and bake another 10 minutes or bake at 350° for approx. 1 hour then add sauce. SAUCE - Mix sauce ingredients together and pour over top when wings are done.
