Another cold morning at 27 degrees. Ground must be frozen as men were out early chisel plowing the fields that were just freshly tiled. They follow along the tile ridges to smooth it out, so fields and pastures are ready for spring. The pastures that are always wet, they had a local tiler come in and tile out all the springs, except one or two in each pasture, and those they connected to water troughs, so cattle always have a fresh water source. And hopefully it will be a better pasturing year, with good grass and water source.

Spring is on its way! Seemed like a short winter to me, with not much snow. Maybe we will get lots of snowy days yet :) Also many of my winter projects are still undone. I have a tote of coon skin hides, waiting to be made into hats. Some are ordered and some I want to make for grandsons. Right now I am re-doing a bedroom upstairs. Have done a little painting in closets, then next step is tearing out old carpet & replacing it with new. Then I have an antique bedroom suite to put into the



room. I scrubbed and polished it clean with beeswax. We are getting the room ready for summer months, as during summer our upstairs bedrooms get used a lot. Some friends are just passing through the area that need lodging for a night or two, and others come for weddings, funerals, etc. The room we are re-doing used to be Harvey's cousin, David's room for many years, and now since he went home to MO to live with his 89 year old mom, we thought it would be a good time to re-do the room. But with my back ache, the project is moving more slowly then I'd like. Several weeks ago I started with severe back aches, am afraid recovery will be slow, as multiple treatments have not been an instant fix as of yet...

But I will keep on going, as slow as I have to, even tho its hard and painful, but sitting around does nothing to help fix it either.

Most greenhouses in this area are already heated and plants started. When I was growing up in PA, everyone in those days started their own plants. I well remember all the nice sunny window sills had trays setting on with starting seedlings, and then as they grew,

the tall leggy plants. Some were later started outdoors in hot beds. Some tiny tender seedlings were started on red bricks. The brick was patted down with fine soil and seeds, then brick was set in a pan or pie plate with approx 1" water, and that kept the soil moist till seedlings were started. Then later we transplanted those in bigger trays, waiting for the right time to plant in the garden

In those days we saved some of our garden seeds from year to year especially the sugar snaps, and one of our favorites but i don't remember the "English" name for it. Kachali is how it sounds. It looked much like a green soybean and mom told us the seeds cannot be bought. We'd eat them in soups or just plain as a vegetable. Delicious! So last year I saw garden soybeans in a seed catalog. I decided to give it a try, because if it says garden soybeans it must be close to what mom had. I watched them grow all summer in my garden. And every time I hoed them I couldn't help but think they look like field beans. So with our first dish of these beans for a meal, Harvey smiled and said "I have more of these in my field". They didn't look or taste at all like I remembered! The extended weather forecast doesnt look promising for another beautiful snowfall, so instead I will dream of a beautiful weed free garden :)

Wilson & Harvey are working cattle, also grading them to different sizes. getting them ready for pastures soon. In between cattle, Harvey & David are bagging compost and filling orders. David's boys do a good job with helping bag compost after school.



Chicken Bacon Ranch Sliders

Ingredients

1 15-ounce package sweet Hawaiian rolls
1/2 cup butter
1 tsp garlic powder
1 tbsp chives
1/2 tsp onion powder
1/3 cup ranch salad dressing
12 slices Colby-Jack cheese
1 pound chicken, deli or pulled (I prefer rotisserie chicken)
12 slices bacon, cooked & crumbled
2 tbsp Parmesan cheese

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F
- 2. Cut the Hawaiian rolls in half so you have a top and bottom. Place the bottom on a baking sheet or in a casserole dish. Set the tops aside.
- 3. Heat the butter until melted. Add the garlic powder, chives, and onion powder.
- 4. Drizzle the ranch dressing on the bottom of the rolls.
- 5. Layer half the cheese on the bottom, then add chicken and bacon and then the rest of the cheese.
- 6. Place the top on each sandwich, brush with the remaining butter, and sprinkle Parmesan cheese.
- 7. Bake for 20 minutes and serve warm with a side of ranch dressing.
