Now the trailer is ready for the next event. The second trailer was filled with tables and chairs there we needed some men to help. The out of state daughters and family left for home late in the afternoon and yes with coolers of leftover food.

LeAnna moved approximately 10 miles from here and plans to be back in the store sometimes. Her husband, Gregory, is building his own repair shop for fixing tractors etc. which he had been doing a few years already in someone else's shop.



ULTIMATE CHEESECAKE RECIPE

Crust:

1 1/2 c. crushed graham crackers
2 Tbsp. sugar
1/4 c. butter, melted

Filling:

5 (8oz.) pkg. cream cheese
1 1/3 c. sugar
3 Tbsp. flour
3 eggs
1/2 c. sour cream, optional
2 tsp. grated lemon peel or juice
1 1/2 tsp. vanilla

Combine crust ingredients and press into a 9" spring form or 9"x13" glass pan. Chill for 30 minutes. Preheat oven to 325 degrees. Beat cream cheese on medium speed for 2 minutes. Add sugar. Gradually add flour. Mix until combined. On low speed, beat in eggs one at a time until just blended. Add remaining ingredients and pour into crust. Bake 1 hour and 15 minutes. Cool. Refrigerate for several hours before eating.

Note: Before serving the waitresses added Red Raspberry Jam on top of each cheesecake.

RANCH POTATO RECIPE

Serves:

Approx. 250 people

Ingredients:

75 lb. potatoes
Add only 1/2 or less salt
13 1/2 c. sour cream
13 1/2 c. Ranch Powder
6 c. chopped bacon
15 c. shredded cheddar cheese
2 2/3 c. parsley

Heat sour cream, Ranch Powder and Parsley on low. Add cheese and bacon. Cook potatoes early. Drain: add dressing and put in sleeping bag until dinner.

Brown 3 lb. butter add: 1 box crushed corn flakes for top of bowls before serving.

Note: Peel, dice, cook and drain potatoes do not over cook, potatoes should be a little firm, layer them in roasters, potatoes first, hot ranch sauce. Repeat the layers and slide the roasters inside sleeping bag with out ever plugging in. Delicious.
