

For base: Butter a 9x12 pan. Lay half of bread in pan. Top with meat and cheese. Put remaining bread on top. Beat eggs, milk, salt and pepper. Add sautéed onion and pepper; pour all over.

For crumb topping: Mix cornflakes and butter; put on top.

Bake 1 hour at 325°.

Rhubarb Pie

1 ¼ cups sugar 1 tablespoon flour 2 beaten egg yolks 2 cups cut-up rhubarb 2 egg whites

Directions

Mix together the first 4 ingredients. Add 2 stiffly beaten egg whites. Pour into an unbaked pie shell & bake until crust is browned and rhubarb is soft.

12 cups rhubarb 8 cups water 4 cups sugar

1 can frozen orange juice Water

Cook together rhubarb and water. Let drip through sieve until all water is out. Add sugar and orange juice. Add water to equal 3 gallons.
